God says His Word is pure.	Proverbs 30:5-6 Every word of God is pure; He is a shield to those who put their trust in Him. Do not add to His words, lest He <u>rebuke</u> you and you be found a liar.	1:3
People witnessed the events of the Bible.	2 Peter 1:16 – For we did not follow <u>cunningly devised fables</u> when we made known to you the power and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, but were <u>eyewitnesses</u> of His <u>majesty</u> .	1:4

Answer	Back up Verses	Chal.
God used at least 40 men to write the Bible – and yet it all fits together.	Luke 1:1-2 – <i>Inasmuch</i> as many have taken in hand to <u>set in order a narrative</u> of those things which have been fulfilled among us. Just as those who from the beginning were eyewitnesses and ministers of the word <u>delivered</u> them to us.	2:2
The Bible was written over 1500 years yet all fits together.	2 Peter 1:21 - For prophecy never came by the will of man, but holy men of God spoke as they were moved by the Holy Spirit.	2:3
Events that were prophesied really happened.	Isaiah 53:7 - He was oppressed and He was afflicted, Yet He opened not His mouth; He was led as a lamb to the slaughter, And as a sheep before its shearers is silent, So He opened not His mouth. <i>(from first page – need to know)</i> Matthew 26:62-63a - And the high priest arose and said to Him, “Do You answer nothing? What is it these men testify against You?” But Jesus kept silent. <i>(1st pg)</i> Deuteronomy 18:22 – When a <u>prophet</u> speaks in the name of the LORD, if the thing does not happen or come to pass, that is the thing which the LORD has not spoken; the <u>prophet</u> has spoken it <u>presumptuously</u> ; you shall not be afraid of him.	2:4
The Bible changes people’s lives.	Acts 16:29-31 - Then he called for a light, ran in and fell down trembling before Paul and Silas. And he brought them out and said, “Sirs, what must I do to be saved?” So they said, “Believe on the Lord Jesus Christ, and you will be saved, you and your household.”	2:6

God wants me to honor Him.	Exodus 20:3-4 – You shall have no other gods before Me. You shall not make for yourself a <u>carved image</u> - any likeness of anything that is in heaven above or that is in the earth beneath or that is in the water under the earth. Exodus 20: 5a – You shall not bow down to them nor serve them. Exodus 20:7a, 8 – You shall not take the name of the LORD your God in vain. Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy.	3:4

You shall not <u>covet</u> your neighbor’s house. You shall not <u>covet</u> your neighbor’s wife, or his male servant nor his female servant, nor his ox, nor his donkey, nor anything that is your neighbor’s.	3:5
God is merciful.	Titus 3:5 – Not by works of righteousness which we have done, but according to His <u>mercy</u> He <u>saved</u> us, through the <u>washing of regeneration</u> and renewing of the Holy Spirit.	3:6
God is merciful.	Romans 3:20 – Therefore by the <u>deeds</u> of the law no flesh will be <u>justified</u> in His sight, for by the law is the knowledge of sin. Romans 3:28 – Therefore we conclude that a man is <u>justified</u> by faith apart from the <u>deeds</u> of the law.	Silver

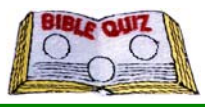
